CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)

 Certified individual working under a nurse to provide basic patient care and services.

TRAINING AND PREREQUISITES

- Completion of an approved CHW Training Program by SD DSS.
- Certification through Indian Health Service Community Health Representative basic training, a CHW program approved by the South Dakota Board of Technical Education or the South Dakota Board of Regents, or a CHW training program approved by the State.
- · High school/GRE diploma.
- Completion of training programs through vocational schools, community colleges, hospitals, high schools, or organizations like the Red Cross.
- Completion of 75 hours of clinical and didactic trainings and testing, required by the SD Board of Nursing.
- · At least 16 hours of clinical practice.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSURE

· No certificate or license is required in SD.

- Certified through the SD Board of Nursing. No license is required in SD.
- Nurse Aide registration is a collaborative process between the SD DOH, SD BON, and SD HCA.

TYPICAL SUPERVISORS

- · Clinic, nursing, or another organizational manager.
- · RN or LPN.
