

POSITION SUMMARY

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER (CHW)

- Frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has a close understanding of the community served.
- Serve as a link between health services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve service delivery.

COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC

- Provide health education, monitoring, and amenities beyond conventional emergency care and transportation.
- Roles are unique to each community's health needs in conjunction with public health and medical advice.

TRAINING AND PREREQUISITES

- Completion of an approved CHW Training Program by SD DSS.
- Certification through Indian Health Service Community Health Representative basic training, a CHW program approved by the South Dakota Board of Technical Education or the South Dakota Board of Regents, or a CHW training program approved by the State.
- Training requirements vary; there are no uniform regulations.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSURE

• No certificate or license is required in SD.

· Varies from state to state.

TYPICAL SUPERVISORS

- · Clinic, nursing, or another organizational manager.
- · Physicians or advanced practice provider.
