EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT)

POSITION SUMMARY

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER (CHW)

- Frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has a close understanding of the community served.
- Serve as a link between health services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve service delivery.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT)

- Provide out of hospital emergency medical care/ transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the EMS system.
- Have the basic knowledge/skills necessary to stabilize and safely transport patients.

TRAINING AND PREREQUISITES

- Completion of an approved CHW Training Program by SD DSS.
- Certification through Indian Health Service Community Health Representative basic training, a CHW program approved by the South Dakota Board of Technical Education or the South Dakota Board of Regents, or a CHW training program approved by the State.
- · Complete state approved EMT training program.
- · Possess a valid CPR certificate.
- · Qualify the NREMT examination.
- · 18 years or older with high school diploma or GED.
- · Pass criminal background screening.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSURE

· No certificate or license is required in SD.

- · Valid South Dakota license through SDDOH.
- Advanced Emergency Medical Technician—required to attend a state-approved, competency-based training course as well

TYPICAL SUPERVISORS

- · Clinic, nursing, or another organizational manager.
- · EMT supervisor, nurse, or physician.
