

POSITION SUMMARY

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER (CHW)

- Frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has a close understanding of the community served.
- Serve as a link between health services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve service delivery.

MEDICAL ASSISTANT (MA)

- · Cross-trained to perform administrative and clinical duties.
- Duties can include aseptic procedures, blood withdrawal, basic first aid, basic laboratory procedures, and general administrative duties.

TRAINING AND PREREQUISITES

- Completion of an approved CHW Training Program by SD DSS.
- Certification through Indian Health Service Community Health Representative basic training, a CHW program approved by the South Dakota Board of Technical Education or the South Dakota Board of Regents, or a CHW training program approved by the State.
- · High school diploma or GED.
- Schools offering MA Training: Globe University, National American University, Lake Area Technical Institute, Mitchell Technical Institute, and Presentation College.
- · On-the-job training that can take several months.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSURE

· No certificate or license is required in SD.

- Registered with Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners or SD Society of Medical Assistants for certification.
- Optional certification: CMA, RMA, NCMA, CCMA, and CMAA.

TYPICAL SUPERVISORS

- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Clinic, nursing, or another organizational manager.
- Physicians, physicians' assistants, nurse practitioners, or nurse midwives.
