- Southeast Technical Institute in Sioux Falls offers the only training program in the state.

· No certificate or license is required in SD.

- Phlebotomy/PCT Diploma.
- · License and certification not required.

TYPICAL SUPERVISORS

- · Clinic, nursing, or another organizational manager.
- RN or LPN.
