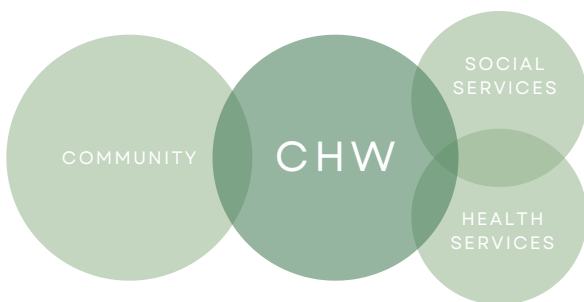




MAIN STREET CLINIC

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER PROGRAM

A community health worker (CHW) is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted community member. They build relationships with patients and connect health and social services in the community. CHWs help patients achieve health goals by addressing each patient's unique needs outside the hospital or clinic setting.



The CHW is embedded within the community and serves as the connector between the community, social services, and health services.

HOW CAN A CHW HELP ME?

Along with your primary care provider, our CHW can help you achieve your health goals and commit to your health care plans by providing resources and information, connecting you to outside help, and acting as an accountability partner to help you build skills to manage different health challenge you may face. Our CHW can also connect you to both health and social resources you may qualify for or need.
